
Ivy Removal

Northwest Forest Plan

The Northwest Forest Plan is undergoing a once-in-a-generation amendment process and a symposium held on Wednesday, January 22nd, on the University of Oregon campus worked to make sure that vital voices are being included in the process.



The symposium brought together multiple groups to make sure that the voices of indigenous communities, environmental justice advocates, and others are included in the forest plan's amendment process. The goal is to educate the community about the critical importance of including indigenous perspectives and indigenous leadership in solving the climate and wildfire crisis affecting northwest forests.
